

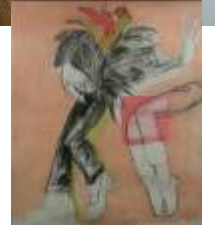


## Vytlacil Campus March update

She intended to spend most of her Vyt AIR time at museums and galleries, and in documenting street art and walls in the City.

His wife gifted him with a two- week Residency because he "deserved to have time to do nothing but paint".
