Children's Class: Drawing, Painting, Design, Composition

Most of the following supplies may be purchased at the League's art supply store, located in the lobby. It is advisable to speak with the instructor before buying supplies.

List of Materials:

- Sketch Book, 14" x 17" (or larger). White paper for drawing Recommended: 90lb. Drawing Paper
- 2. Scissors.
- 3. **Colored Pencils, Cray-Pas, Pastels** for color drawings, markers can be used, but they are harder to blend than pencils and pastels.
- 4. **Pencils**, 2H, H, HB, 2B, 4B (a range from hard to soft). Ebony brand pencils can be used as well. They have a richer tone than regular graphite pencils.
- 5. **Erasers**. Soft ones. White, pink or gray soft erasers.
- 6. **Pencil Sharpener**. Preferably one with a case to catch fillings.
- 7. **Ruler** (optional).
- 8. **Elmer's Glue** (white with orange top. Glue Sticks can also be used).
- 9. **Scotch Transparent Tape**. One roll should be enough.
- 10. Newspapers and Magazines for collage
- 11. Painting Materials:

Liquitex brand Basics, set of 8 (eight) acrylic colors.

Flat bristle brushes size: 12, 10, 8, 6.

Smock or old shirt – acrylic paint does not come out of clothes

Palette (or disposable palette)

Empty plastic cups, yogurt containers at least three each

I Roll of paper towels - one bar of soap

Later on: I will supply newspapers and magazines for use in making collages. Students should bring in any materials they feel can be added to their collages.
